Pianist, composer, teacher

A seasoned musician, having begun in Montréal with studies in piano and solfège (sight singing), playing guitar and singing folk songs during the early sixties – the era of Beatlemania – also help to shape the artist!

At the University of Windsor he earned his BMus, was awarded the Board of Governors Medal, and pursued post-graduate studies in piano performance.

Wayne earned the Associate Diploma at the Royal Conservatory of Music, followed a few years later by composition studies with Dr. Samuel Dolin, Past President of the Canadian League of Composers, and choral conducting sessions with top composer-choral clinicians. Of special note was his mentor, Mme. Dusi Mura.

He has taught piano, theory, composition, ear training, and keyboard harmony for over 35 years, and counts among his students Timothy Pressey, Silver Medallist, highest in Ontario, Grade 6 Piano RCM (2003); Benjamin Sajo, First Place CFMTA Composition Competition provincially, Second Place nationally (2005)

His original compositions exceed 100, and are written for orchestra, chamber music ensembles, solo voice and instruments, choir, children, and electronic media. His numerous works have been performed by soloists, vocal and instrumental ensembles – both amateur and professional. He is the collaborative pianist with the New Tecumseth Singers (with its CD release, Look to this Day) and has served as accompanist for innumerable vocalists and instrumentalists at concerts and festivals. Wayne is also Music Director-Organist at St. Andrew Anglican, Alliston.
